

President Submits FY2011 Budget Priorities to Congress

On February 1, President Barack Obama delivered his \$3.8 trillion FY2011 budget to Congress. The Budget contains agency-specific requests for the upcoming fiscal year. Congress is expected to begin its budget process – consideration and passage of a budget resolution – in the spring.

The following charts summarize President Obama’s budget proposal for several programs important to women and their families. Comparisons to FY2010 reflect spending levels passed by Congress in the FY2010 omnibus spending bill (P.L. 111-117); Agriculture, Food and Drug Administration, Rural Development and Related Agencies (P.L. 111-80); and Legislative Branch (P.L. 111-68) spending bills (see [FY2010 Appropriations Summary](#), 12/22/09). Unless otherwise specified, all page numbers refer to pages in the respective department or agency budget documents (links to those documents are provided).

Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration, and Related Agencies

President Obama’s budget would provide \$149 billion in overall spending for the Department of Agriculture (p. 1), an increase of \$14 billion over FY2010. Of that amount, discretionary spending would total \$26 billion, while mandatory spending would total \$123 billion.

Like last year, the president’s budget includes \$10 billion over ten years for “a strong Child Nutrition reauthorization package aimed at ending childhood hunger, reducing childhood obesity, and improving the diets of our children and raising program performance to better serve our children” (p. 177 of the [Office of Management and Budget \(OMB\) document](#)).

Commerce, Justice, Science, and Related Agencies

The FY2011 Department of Justice budget request contains \$29.19 billion in discretionary funds, an increase of \$1.49 billion over FY2010 (p. 1 of the Department of Justice [budget summary](#)).

The president's request doubles the funding for sexual assault victims services to \$30 million and provides \$50 million for civil legal assistance for victims, an increase of \$9 million.

The budget would establish funding for two new programs within the Office on Violence Against Women (OVW). According to the OMB document, the request would provide \$500,000 to establish a national clearinghouse to provide training and technical assistance on issues relating to sexual assault of American Indian and Alaska Native women and \$500,000 for OVW "to sponsor regional summits on violence against women in Indian country for Department of Justice representatives, local tribal advocates, law enforcement, and judges" (p. 780 of [OMB document](#)).

The budget would provide \$150 million for a new DNA initiative within the Office of Justice Programs. This program would take the place of previous DNA-related programs, including the Debbie Smith DNA Backlog Grants and Sexual Assault Forensic Exams programs.

Defense

The president's request calls for \$708.2 billion for Department of Defense spending in FY2011, an increase of \$47.9 billion over FY2010 (p. 6). It includes \$8.8 billion in support for military families, including child care services, spousal education programs, and improved housing.

In addition to the programs listed below, President Obama's request for federal payments to the District of Columbia include \$20 million for D.C. public school reform (p. 1,244) and \$5 million for the District's HIV/AIDS prevention efforts (p. 1,245).

Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies

President Obama's FY2011 request for the Department of Labor totals \$13.98 billion in discretionary spending, a decrease of \$32 million from FY2010 (p. 1). This amount includes \$85 million for the Green Jobs Innovation Fund (p. 8) and \$3.581 billion for unemployment insurance (p. 26).

In addition, the request would establish a State Paid Leave Fund, which would provide \$50 million in competitive grants to assist states in establishing paid leave programs that would allow employees to take paid family and medical leave (p. 37).

The FY2011 budget request for the Department of Health and Human Services is \$901.927 billion (including \$21.066 billion from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act [P.L. 111-5]). This amount is \$56.465 billion over FY2010 and includes \$81 billion in discretionary spending.

The request also includes \$129.218 million in competitive grants to fund medically accurate and age appropriate programs that reduce teen pregnancy; \$85 million to replicate programs proven effective in reducing teen pregnancy and underlying behavioral risk factors; \$28 million for research and demonstration grants to "develop, replicate, refine, and test additional models and innovative strategies for preventing teen pregnancy"; and \$4.445 million to evaluate existing teen pregnancy prevention approaches (p. 502 of the OMB document).

The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program also would be increased under the president's FY2011 budget. All programs under TANF would be extended for one year. The budget also includes \$500 million for a Fatherhood, Marriage, and Families Innovation Fund; funds within the existing Healthy Marriage and Responsible Fatherhood program would be redirected to the newly established fund (p. 492 of the OMB document). In addition, the budget includes a \$2.5 billion TANF emergency fund, which would help states continue administering their respective programs (p. 6).

The president's request includes \$77.8 billion for the Department of Education, an increase of \$18.6 billion over FY2010. This amount includes \$50.7 billion in discretionary spending and \$27.1 billion in mandatory spending.

The president's request would make funding for the Pell Grant program mandatory.

The president's FY2011 budget request for the State Department and U.S. Agency for International Development \$52.8 billion, \$16.419 billion of which is for the State Department operations and \$36.4 billion of which is for foreign assistance.

Secretary Hillary Clinton's budget transmittal letter notes that women are at the forefront of the department's efforts: "Putting women front and center is at the core of all of these efforts. Women are critical to advancing social, economic, and political progress. They are also a terrific return on investment: numerous studies have shown that when women receive schooling or the boost of a small loan, they flourish, their children flourish, and so does the greater community."
