

## President Submits FY2014 Budget Priorities to Congress

On April 10, President Barack Obama delivered to Congress his \$3.8 trillion FY2014 budget, which contains department- and agency-specific funding requests for the upcoming fiscal year. As he did during his State of the Union address in January (see [The Source](#), 2/15/13), President Obama's budget message focused on several priority areas: "Making America a Magnet for Jobs, Building a 21st Century Infrastructure, Equipping Americans with the Skills They Need, Making the Tax Code More Simple and Fair, Ensuring Hard Work Leads to a Decent Living, and Cutting the Deficit in a Balanced Way."

Congress enacted a continuing resolution (P.L. 112-175) in September 2012 (see [The Source](#), 9/21/12), which then was extended through September 2013 on March 21 (see [The Source](#), 3/25/13). The president's FY2014 budget reflects the funding levels in the continuing resolution (CR), but does not include the across-the-board cuts imposed by the Budget Control Act (P.L. 112-25), also known as sequestration. Instead, the president proposes to replace the sequestration cuts with \$1.8 trillion in additional deficit reduction over ten years. The deficit reduction plan would be comprised of additional cuts in federal spending and increased revenue.

The following charts summarize President Obama's budget proposal for programs important to women and their families (see also the White House fact sheet, "[Strengthening the Economy for Women and Girls](#)"). Unless otherwise specified, all page numbers refer to pages in the respective department or agency budget documents (links to those documents are provided).

### Department of Agriculture

According to the Department of Agriculture budget summary, President Obama's budget requests roughly \$146 billion in overall spending for the Department of Agriculture in FY2014. The president's request for the department in FY2013 was \$153 billion in overall spending.

The three accounts are: International Disaster Assistance (emergency food response), Development Assistance for Community Development and Resilience Fund (the fund addresses chronic food insecurity in areas of recurrent crises), and the new Emergency Food Assistance Contingency Fund.

Department of Defense

The president's request calls for a base budget of \$526.6 billion in FY2014. In addition, the request calls for \$88.5 billion for overseas contingency operations (OCO), bringing the total request to \$615.1 billion in FY2014. The administration requested \$614.8 billion in FY2013, which included \$525.4 billion in base funding and \$88.5 billion in OCO. The request includes funding for programs for military personnel and families, health programs, and housing.

Department of Education

The request includes \$71.2 billion in discretionary funds for the Department of Education in FY2014, which represents a \$2.8 billion increase over the FY2013 request.

The president proposes \$265 million in new funds for a "comprehensive science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) Innovation proposal to improve the delivery and impact of federal investments in STEM education."

The administration's request also includes \$1.3 billion over ten years for a Preschool for All program.

Department of Labor

President Obama requested \$12.1 billion in discretionary spending in FY2014 for the Department of Labor. This amount is virtually identical to the president's FY2013 request.

Department of State/USAID

The budget request for the State Department and the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) totals \$47.8 billion for FY2014, and is \$3.8 billion below the president's FY2013 request. This amount includes funding for several global health programs housed at the State Department, as well as at USAID.

The budget request for the State Department indicates that global health programs will be focused in three key areas: saving the lives of mothers and children, creating an AIDS-free generation, and protecting communities from infectious diseases.

The administration's request includes \$19 million to promote "gender equality and advancement of the political, economic, social, and cultural status of women and girls" (p. 80) and \$20 million for a special representative for global women's issues (p. 95). Of that amount, \$15 million would be allocated for a new State Department Full Participation Fund. "The Fund's purpose is to advance gender equality and the status of women and girls in all foreign policy objectives, highlighting activities in women's political and civic participation; women and the economy; and women, peace and security."
